



## Low Cost Panel Income Guidelines

- ✓ Need to add or subtract *child support or alimony* payments to monthly income.
- ✓ For family units with more than six (6) members, add \$9,440 to the 200% annual rate.
- ✓ In addition to income guidelines, clients may not exceed the maximum of \$2,500 in *assets*, excluding the value of the person's homestead.

### **Family Law & Landlord Tenant Fees:**

- ✓ \$1,000 Retainer fee to attorney upfront (will cover up to 10 Hours).
- ✓ Attorney will bill \$100 per hour for each additional hour of service.
- ✓ The client is responsible for court costs such as filing fees.

\* If the case client has a final hearing (trial) or case is very complicated, the attorney is entitled to change his/her legal fees.

### **Criminal Law Fees:**

- ✓ **Felony/DUI:** \$1,000 Retainer fee upfront. Attorney can bill up to \$140 per hour, plus court cost but no more than \$6,000 in total.
- ✓ **Misdemeanor:** \$500 Retainer fee upfront. Attorney can bill up to \$140 per hour, plus court cost but no more than \$3,000 in total.

\*Attorney can charge more depending upon how many criminal charges. Federal Crimes and Violation of probation are not taken under Low Cost, and they must be referred to an attorney with at least 6 year of trial experience.
